### Frank Gaffney (00:18):

Welcome to Securing America with me, Frank Gaffney, the program that's a kind of owner's manual for protecting the country we love against all enemies foreign and domestic to the glory of God and his kingdom.

Well, when we talk about the country we love and enemies foreign and domestic that threaten it, and the urgent need for us to be protecting our country, I want to give you some good news. China was the world's biggest market. They could manufacture everything. They were going to do all the hard work, and we were just going to reap the benefits of our massive trade deficit. And obviously things have not worked out that way. And I think you've really opened my eyes to all of these issues.
